- 1. Eligibility. Contest is open to anyone.
- 2. Original, unpublished work. Not in print or published electronically.
- 3. Previous awards. Poems which have won monetary awards are not eligible.

#### 4. Poem format

- In English, typed/computer-generated, 12 or 14 point.
- · No fancy fonts or illustrations.
- 40-line limit, unless specified. Title and one following blank line are not included in the line count. All other blank lines are included in the count.
- One single-spaced poem per page.

#### 5. Simultaneous Submissions/Awards

- No poem may be submitted in more than one category.
- No poet can win two awards in the same category.
- 6. Titles. Except haiku, title all poems.
- 7. Submit two copies of each poem.
  - Originals. In the upper left-hand corner include: Number and name of category; your name, address, e-mail, and phone number; the word "MEMBER" if you have current membership in ISPS.
  - Duplicates. In the upper left-hand corner include ONLY number and name of contest category.
  - Two Stacks. Separate originals from duplicates and stack in numerical order with originals on top.

#### 8. Entry Fees (one poem per category)

- ISPS Members. \$10 flat fee, includes an entry in one or all categories.
- NON-ISPS MEMBERS. \$20 flat fee, includes an entry in one or all categories.

#### SUBMISSION DEADLINE

Submissions must be postmarked:

August 1 to October 31, 2024

## What's New at Brewed Awakening

For more than 18 years, the Illinois State Poetry Society has sponsored a poetry reading the last Sunday of each month (except December) at **Brewed Awakening Coffeeshop** in Westmont. On September 29, **Dr. E.J. Wade** will be one of the features. A three-time *Pushcart Award* nominee, she is an educator and poet whose writing focuses on the silencing, exclusion, and invisibility of African-American Women and their narratives. Literary Editor of the *Anthology of Appalachian Writers*, she currently works as a Homebound Tutor for Oak Park River Forest High School located in Oak Park, Illinois. Wade's poems are published in the *Anthology of Appalachian Writers*, Women Speak, the New Ohio Review, Salvation South, and Callaloo Literary Journal. She holds a Doctor of Education from National Louis University, an MA in Appalachian Studies from Shepherd University and an MA of Creative Media Practices from the University of The West of Scotland.






**Colleen McManus Hein** recently self-published her debut poetry collection, **Come December**, earlier this summer and it is now available on Amazon.
