

Any submission that does not follow ALL guidelines will be disqualified.

- 1. Eligibility. Original work of a single student in a public or private Illinois school or home-schooled in Illinois.
- 2. Entries. Only one poem per category. No poem can be submitted to multiple categories.

 3. Unpublished. Poems published in print or online or accepted for publication (except in school publications) are ineligible.
- 4. Simultaneous Submissions. Poems currently entered in other contests are not eligible.

POEM & PAGE FORMATS

- English only.
- · Lines. All text and blank lines count except the title and one blank line after title.
- · Line width. Maximum: 50 characters,

includes punctuation marks and spaces.

- Single-spaced lines.
- One poem per 8.5" x 11" page
- . Typed or computer-generated, 12 point, plain font (Times New Roman, etc.) on white paper. No artwork.
- . Title all poems except haiku.

PREPARING SUBMISSIONS

1. Submit two typed copies of each poem (one anonymous for the judge; one with ID). Include contest number and title on the upper

2. ID Copy Only: On the upper right include:

- Student's name, age, grade level.
 School/home-school name and address (city/state/zip required). Teacher/Sponsor's name (first and last name and Mr./Ms./Mrs.).
- Teacher/Sponsor's email address.
- Add on the page a statement signed by the student: "I certify that this poem is my original work (no Al assist) and has not been copied in whole or part from any author's poem in print or posted on the Internet."

Signed

- 3. Copies. Do not separate the copies. Do not staple the copies together
- 4. Batched Mailings: Teachers/Sponsors may send all students' poems in one envelope.
- Sort poems by contest number.
- . Keep anonymous and ID copies together (no staples or paper clips).
- Include your email address.
- 5. Self-entered. An individual student may submit entries in a single mailing

6. Fees. There are no entry fees.

DEADLINE: Postmark must be between December 1, 2024–February 28, 2025



Poets for Peace is open to all poets interested in supporting world-peace projects. The group organized in response to the inspiring June 2024 presentation of "Writing Under Fire" by celebrated poet Ihor Pavlyuk at a National Federation of Poetry Societies convention.

Our Initial Projects: #2

- · A 2024 fundraiser for trauma therapy equipment for a Ukraine orphanage. Donations have exceeded the \$6,000 goal.
- A 2025 anthology of peace poems. Any poet may send submissions. Detailed guidelines will be posted on www.nfsps.net.
- Free 2025 entertainment events that feature poetry readings along with music, drama or other arts, plus information about Poets for Peace. Donations accepted at the events will fund future projects.

Poets for Peace is creating an anthology of peace poems to raise awareness about challenges facing orphans of war in Ukraine. All proceeds from this project will provide much-needed assistance to programs that provide crucial recovery resources for Ukraine's orphans.

Submission Guidelines

Any submission not meeting all guidelines will be disqualified.

- **1. Eligibility.** Submissions are open to all, including international poets.
- 2. Theme. The theme of all anthology poems will be peace, including the toll of war, life during wartime, fears, hopes, challenges, dreams, etc.
- 3. Literary Standards. We will not publish work that includes gratuitous profanity, or is obscene, sexually graphic, hate-mongering, or abusive of any social, racial, ethnic, religious, or gender group.
- 4. Poems. By making a submission, the poet affirms poems are their original work, without A.I. assistance. Previously published poems must include source attribution.
- 5. **Line limits.** Each poem is limited to 35 lines, including blank lines. Do not count the title and blank line following the title. No line will exceed 50 characters, including punctuation.
- **6. Font.** Use a plain font. Times New Roman, 12 point is preferred.
- 7. Submissions. Make only one submission, which can include up to three poems (three is preferred). An experienced review panel will select one qualifying poem for the anthology.
- **8. Submission Files.** Submit poems, one poem per page, as pdf., .doc, .docx, or .rtf file. Poet's name, address, email address and phone number must be included on the upper left corner of each page.

Submissions from Ukrainian poets may be in their native language, accompanied by an English translation.

- Submission period. Submissions will close at a maximum of 150 poets, between January 1, 2025 through midnight EST, March 31, 2025.
- 10. Submission email. Send only one email. In the subject line, type POETS FOR PEACE SUBMISSIONS. In the body of the email, type your name as you want it to appear in the anthology, plus your address, email address, phone number, and the number of poems you are submitting. Attach poem file, and send via email to: poets4peace.anthology@gmail.com.
- **11. Exclusions.** We cannot accept poems embedded in the body of an email or paper copies sent by mail.
- 12. Submission fee. There is no fee for Ukrainian poets. A fee of \$10 for all other poets can be paid by credit or debit card or PayPal at the Sunflower Poetry Society of Kansas website. Click on "Poets for Peace Anthology fee" at the bottom of the homepage.
- **13. Notification.** Poets will be notified of receipt of poems, fee payment, and anthology selection no later than May 1, 2025.




Jane Richards, a North Suburban Chapter member, will be a
